

1 section 825 of the Penal Code within which a defendant charged with a felony offense must be
2 taken before a magistrate from 48 hours to not more than 5 days (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(8));

3 In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from March 17, 2020, to
4 April 17, 2020, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in
5 section 859b of the Penal Code for the holding of a preliminary examination from 10 court days
6 to not more than 15 court days (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(9));

7 In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from March 17, 2020, to
8 April 3, 2020, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in
9 section 1382 of the Penal Code for the holding of a criminal trial by not more than 30 days (Gov.
10 Code, § 68115(a)(10));

11 In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would from March 17, 2020, to April
12 3, 2020, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in section 313 of
13 the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody pending dependency
14 proceedings must be released from custody to not more than 5 days (Gov. Code,
15 § 68115(a)(11));

16 In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from March 17, 2020, to
17 April 3, 2020, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in
18 section 315 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody
19 pending dependency proceedings must be given a detention hearing to not more than 5 days
20 (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(11));

21 In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from March 17, 2020, to
22 April 3, 2020, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time periods provided in
23 sections 632 and 637 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into
24 custody pending wardship proceedings and charged with a felony must be given a detention
25 hearing or rehearing to not more than 5 days (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(11));

26 In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from March 17, 2020, to
27 April 3, 2020, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in
28 section 334 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a hearing on a juvenile

1 dependency petition must be held by not more than 15 days (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(12)); and

2 In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from March 17, 2020, to
3 April 3, 2020, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in
4 section 657 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a hearing on a wardship petition
5 for a minor charged with a felony offense must be held by not more than 15 days (Gov. Code,
6 § 68115(a)(12)).

8 It is also Ordered that each Judicial Officer of the Superior Court of San Joaquin County
9 is hereby deputized to effectuate all of the above provisions.
